

EASY LACE SUMMER SCARF

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This is a great piece of mindless knitting that results in a reversible lacy summer scarf that will be a fashionable addition to any wardrobe. Makes a great gift item. Cast on, watch a couple of movies, and you are done!



MATERIALS

1 ball Zooley by Juniper Moon (60% cotton / 40% linen—100g=284yds)

1 pair US#7 knitting needles (shorts or circular, whatever you prefer)

1 US—H crochet hook (only needed if you use the crochet cast on)

NOTE: This scarf is knit to the length you want. However, there is enough yardage in the Zooley to knit two shorter scarves. If you want to do that, I would recommend that you wind off 50grams of yarn, splitting the ball in half. You can knit until you have about a yard left to knit the final row, then the bind off row. As far as width, I suggest a sample swatch. Increase or decrease the width in increments of 4 stitches to work the double sided lace pattern.

You can use any CAST ON technique you wish, but I prefer the crochet cast on, because it will perfectly match the knit bind off at the other end.

CAST ON 24 stitches

KNIT 2 rows

BEGIN DOUBLE-SIDED LACE PATTERN

EACH AND EVERY ROW IS THE SAME: *K2tog, YO, K2*, repeat * to *

This is a lace faggoting stitch that is a 4 stitch repeat, and should end evenly each row. If you don't end the repeat evenly, check for the error before proceeding.

Knit to the length you want.

Knit one row.

Bind off in knit.

WET FINISH: Hand wash OR place in a zippered laundry bag and use the delicate cycle with warm water. Hand block flat to dry. Lightly steam open using a pressing cloth.

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
